## Activity Challenges in West Hunsbury Parks for Summer 2020.

(Hunsbury Hill Country Park, Wootton Brook and Ladybridge Park)

How many of the following tasks can you complete during August 2020? Send your results to the Friends of West Hunsbury Parks at [FriendsOWHP@gmail.com](mailto:FriendsOWHP@gmail.com).

- 1. Go for a walk around the parks**, following the map shown in the Friends of West Hunsbury Parks leaflet. You can find these in the café at the Country park. Take a photograph if you can of the four brown information boards as you go, showing the subject each board depicts. Alternatively draw a map of the route you take and note the 'points of interest' that you visit.
  - 2. How many kinds of birds can you spot on the lake in Wootton Brook Park?** These should be birds you actually see. **Make a list of the birds you see and try to find out what each type of bird feeds on.** Take some photographs if you can.
  - 3. Try to find out why it is wrong to feed bread to waterfowl. What would you do to discourage people from giving bread to these birds?** Let us have your ideas.
  - 4. Write down three things that you do in the West Hunsbury Parks.** Let us know what these are. **What do you like doing most in the Parks?**
  - 5. Take some photographs or do drawings to show the four best things and the four worst things about the Park.** Send us your photographs or scanned drawings.
  - 6. Make an A4 poster that would either attract moreitors to the Park or help reduce antisocial activity.** Scan or photograph your poster and send it to us.
  - 7. See if you can find examples of the following trees in West Hunsbury Parks: ash, beech, horse chestnut, sweet chestnut, lime, holly, holly-oak, walnut. Try to find out which are native trees, and which are introduced to this country as 'ornamental' trees.** If you can, take some photographs of the trees and let us know how you get on.
  - 8. Make a map of the Hunsbury Hill Country Park showing its most interesting and unusual features. What do you think is most interesting about the Country Park.** Send us a copy of your map and your ideas.
